




Virtual **Hangouts** through the year helped kids and teens to connect socially and build special bonds from hospital beds, couches, and backyards.



2. NET ASSETS West Coast Kids Cancer Foundation has established a goal of beginning each fiscal year with approximately 20% of that year's budgeted expenditures on hand. At December 31, 2023, the foundation's net assets represented 20.1% of its 2024 budgeted expenditures.
