We learned from families that the WCK meal options meant their children on treatment always had something palatable and tasty available to eat, as soon as they felt able to eat. This sustained them through treatment and helped to overcome the impact of treatment on their appetites.

Parents kept telling us that WCK meals were their own personal "lifesaver meals." Being able to nourish themselves, and knowing that a community around them cares for their wellbeing, meant the world to them.

YOU MADE CAMP MAGICAL.

Childhood cancer and blood disorders isolate kids, but at WCK City Camp, they finally find a place where their diagnosis isn't the centre of attention. Here, kids are free to create delightful chaos, make friends, and laugh until their bellies hurt – all while staying under close medical supervision, sleeping in their own bed at night, and not missing important appointments.

Over the years, you've helped create a magical experience for over **160 different kids** at City Camp. Research shows that children often lose out on regular childhood experiences due to their diagnosis and treatment, and it's at camp where those formative experiences are restored.

YOU SUPPORTED YOUNG PEOPLE.

By supporting The Club program, you enabled **39 young adults** to access year-round support in a way that fits their unique needs. Diagnoses of PTSD are common when survivors become young adults, and having cancer places children at significant risk of long-term social and emotional difficulties. They've experienced significant trauma early on in life.

The Club uses a youth work approach through gentle, low-barrier programming which improves participants' sense of safety in the world. They are equipped to build supportive peer relationships and enter adult life with more resilience and an enhanced sense of wellbeing. Thanks to you, we made life feel manageable and the world feel safer for some incredible young people as they begin to navigate adult life.

My mom always told me I'm not alone. At The Club, I was finally able to see that. We were able to share our experiences in a safe space. I felt more happy with myself and more open to sharing with friends about what I deal with behind-thescenes.

YOU SHOWED UP FOR CAREGIVERS.

We have learned from our families – and from research – that parents are known as "hidden patients." Their significant needs at a distressing time usually go unmet because the focus of interventions and resources is on their sick child. We also know that, by supporting their psychosocial, emotional, and informational needs, we can prevent the caregiver exhaustion that is evidenced to lead to mental health difficulties.

Thanks to your support, we were able to hire a Mental Health Resource Coordinator this year, and expand mental health programming. **We went from supporting 11 caregivers in 2023 to over 131 so far in 2024.** Ongoing funding will resource us to continue to expand our reach and launch a comprehensive new Peer Support program for caregivers in 2025.

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
